

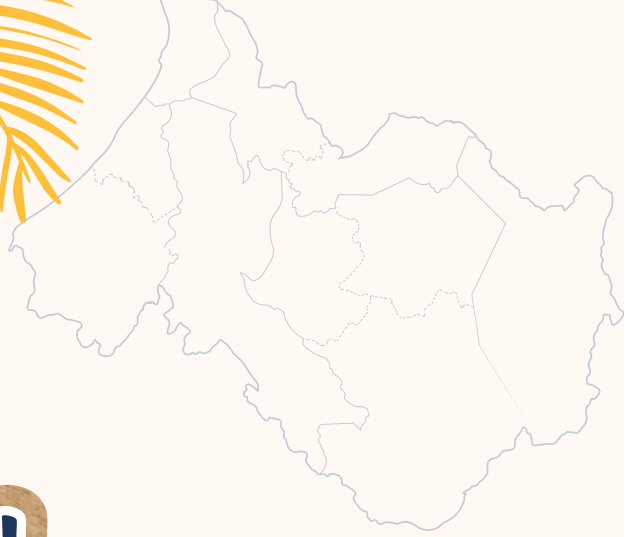

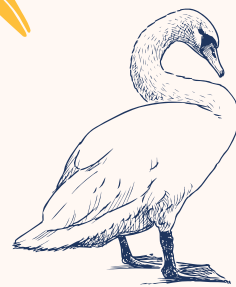

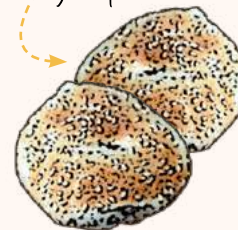

Mukah town is perfectly laid out with commercial buildings and hotels. The bustling market and bazaar along the wharf are worth a visit. Here, the fishermen unload the day's catch in the early hours of the morning. The market will also be teeming with an astounding variety of seafood and shellfish.

A 10 minutes' drive from Mukah town, this village has stood in its present location along the Telian River since time immemorial. Around 3,000 residents live in and around the three main villages connected with plank walkways...

The village is known to have the remaining two burial totem poles known as Jerunai...



Sago logs are towed along the waterways to reach sago processing factories downriver where they will be processed into little Sago balls and then baked with firewood...

Linut is made from sago flour which is mixed with room temperature water first before adding hot water until it becomes goey and sticky. It can be eaten with sambal or tempoyak...

Umai (Melanau Ceviche) is made from raw fish cured in lime juice and spiced with shallots and chilli...

This Jerunai or Kelidieng (sacrificial burial pole) is said to be the best-preserved, situated outside the district office...

Kanowit

The town's name is derived from the name of the earliest ethnic group settling along the Kanowit River. It takes 45 minutes to reach the town by land transport and an hour by boat from Sibu.

One of the oldest settlements in Sibu comprise of 9 longhouses dating from the 18th century and it's a 40 minute's ride from Sibu by boat or vehicle...

Fort Emma Jalan Kubu, 96700 Kanowit, Sarawak

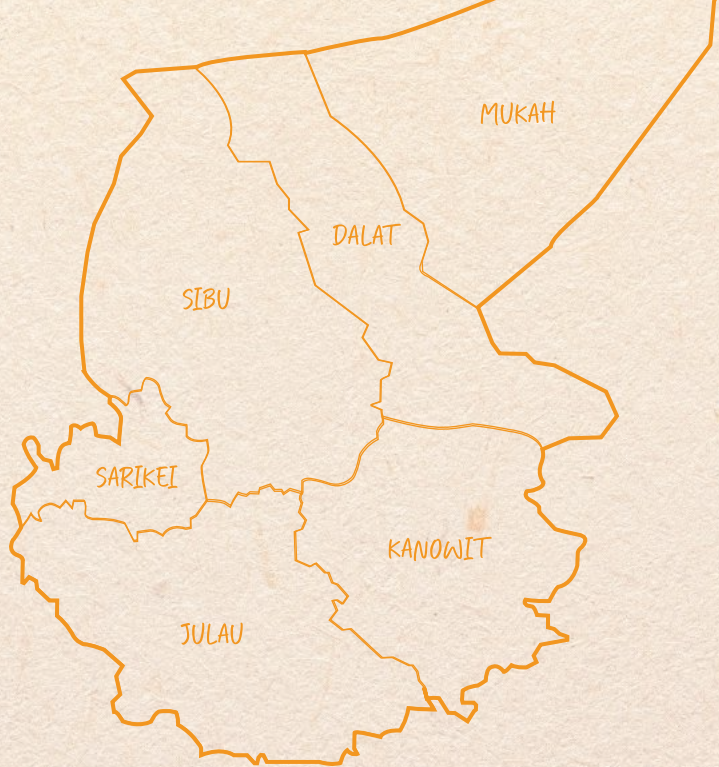
